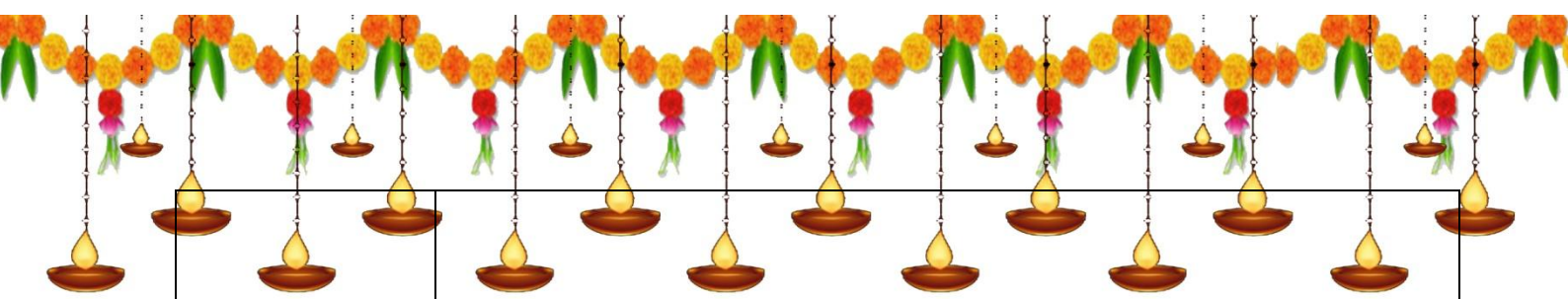




Honour of the Divine Feminine

Outcome:

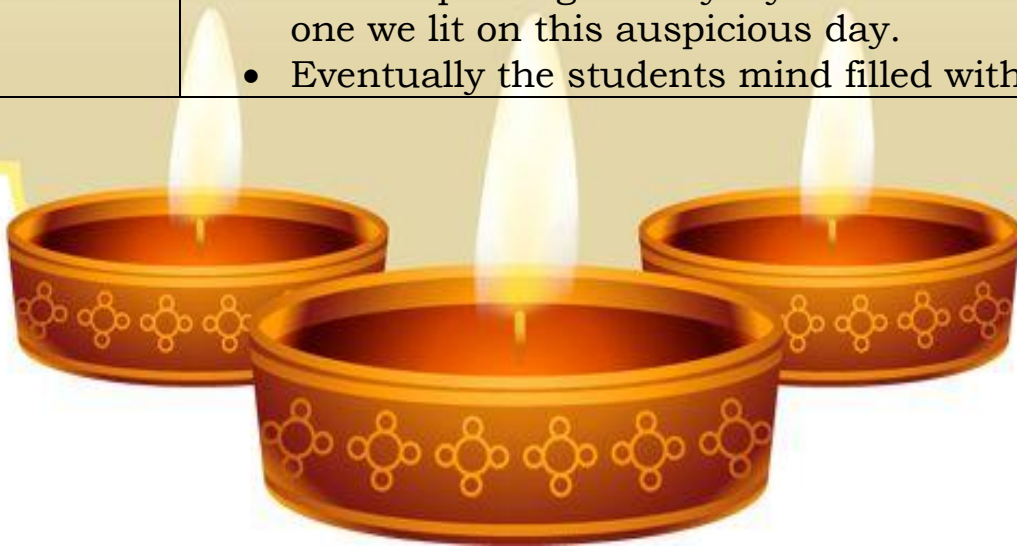
