




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Title	World Aids day

Outcome	Myths surrounding HIV/AIDS transmission are debunked, including the belief that HIV can be transmitted through touch, cough or sharing food.





Outcome	 Many Students achieved their target activity and realized their strength. Few realized their weakness and tried for rectification.





Outcome


Students whole-heartedly chanted slokas on Guru and offered flowers to show their reverence towards the Guru.

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
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
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


Title	Navaratri celebration

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








Title	Kuthu Vilakku Pooja


Title	Hanuman Jayanthi

Kindergarten is the foundation of a child's formal learning. With the skills the children learn in kindergarten, they can seamlessly transition into the school environment and then into life.










Annual Day Feedback 2.3.24


